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Awards & Achievements

World Schools Debating

Hasan Dindjer (U6H2) and Edward Schwitzer (U6R2) represented England in February at the 22nd World Schools Debating Championships held in Doha, Qater. They were part of a team of four students who won through to the finals but lost to Canada. England opposed the prepared motion that "governments should never bail out big companies" in the final.



French Debating Competition

February saw the final of Les Joutes Oratoires, the L6 French Debating Competition organised by our French assistant, Nicolas Reynard. All thirty-six L6 boys who study French took part in the competition and they are to be congratulated on an extremely high level of argument and language. The final was fiercely fought between Ben Poster (L6J1) and Anthony Meyer (L6H1) and the opposition team, Joel Kariel (L6S2) and Raphael Torrance (L6R2). The judges, the Headmaster and Dr Koestlé-Cate, finally awarded the debate to Joel and Raph. We are looking forward to seeing our teams in action against other schools from North London in the summer term.



Quiz Bowl

In March, a team of Sixth Formers were runners-up in the Annual Quiz Bowl run by the American School in London. The format is similar to *University Challenge*. The HABS team, consisting of Brett Bernstein (U6R1), Jonathan Metzer (U6C2), Andrew Rose (U6S2) and David Woolfman (U6H2), had a 100% record throughout the qualifying stages and defeated the hosts in the semi-final. Unfortunately, they went down narrowly in the final to a strong Latymer Upper side that they had defeated earlier in the day.



Geography Quiz

In February, Years 7, 8 and 9 participated in the first annual Geography Quiz. The quiz consisted of several rounds, including an O.S. map round, a picture round and an A-Z on worldwide objects and places. 26 teams took part in this joint event with the Girls' School. The GlobeTrotters from Year 7 (Dylan Dissanayake, Jacob Knight and Khush Kotecha, 7H) were victorious in the end, with Team Red Bull in second place.



University Offers

Once again, HABS has secured an impressive total of Oxbridge offers. Thirty-eight U6 applicants were successful this year, with sixteen boys heading to Oxford and twentytwo to Cambridge. This is the school's highest number of entrants since 2006, and follows on from last year's spectacular A Level performance. HABS remains at the forefront of university admissions, with other destinations including Imperial, UCL, King's, Durham, Bristol, Edinburgh, Warwick, Manchester, Nottingham and Birmingham. We wish the boys the best of luck in their decisive A2 examinations this summer.

HABS Art Ties

The Art Tie is the highest accolade that Art students can gain at HABS and they are awarded annually to those students who have shown exceptional artistic ability. This year's 24 winners have produced a range of very successful images in a wide variety of different media and are considered the very best artists in the school.

Events

Tatchell Talks

In February, political campaigner Peter Tatchell addressed the Politics Society on his concerns about the current state of democracy in the UK. Tatchell argued that the current electoral system results in unrepresentative governments that are a far cry from democracy. The lecture was well received by a keen and inquisitive audience.

Particular congratulations go to Matthew Naughton (U6R2) who received the Sheila Watson Prize for String Playing, Brett Bernstein (U6R1) and Andrew Campbell (U6H1) who share the Wesley Woodage Brass Prize, and Aaron Taylor who received the Woodwind Prize.





Sport

Football

The 1st XI began promisingly with a 2-0 win over St Columba's College, but HABS failed to qualify for the quarter finals of the LB Cup. The 2nd XI is starting to prove a useful feeder club for the 1st XI. The first match played by the 3rd XI resulted in a disappointing 4-0 defeat at Radley but it was followed by a comfortable 3-0 victory over Merchant Taylors'. The U16A team had a convincing 4-0 win over St Albans. Radley proved tougher opposition and HABS went down 2-1 in an excellent match. The U16B team has had a drastically shortened season so far, with just one game having been played.

Cricket

The various squads have all been practising hard in the newly refurbished Indoor Nets, thanks to the generosity of the Kansagra family, and the outlook is promising. In addition to the well established 1st XI and U13 Devon Tours, we are hoping to organise a short tour for the U14s. The penultimate week of the summer term is Cricket Week, during which several important games will be played at all age levels. Your support at these games and throughout the season will, of course, be most welcome.

Golf

HABS' Golfers have had a very successful season to date. The squad of William Aldred (9S2), Aidan Kovenklioglu (8J), Nick Mason (11J1), Harry Kovenklioglu (11J2), Ben Cherkas (L6R2), Philip Bagshaw (U6C1) and Shan Ahluwalia (U6J2) reached the Eastern Region semi-final of the HMC Foursomes, with victories over Merchant Taylors' and Mill Hill, before a narrow 2-1 defeat at the hands of Bedford in early March. Elsewhere, a three man singles team has entered the ISGA matchplay tournament, and at the time of writing we look forward to a regional final against Felsted School. Earlier rounds saw the team succeed against Mill Hill, Brentwood and St Columba's College.

Golf Tour

The 2010 Golf Tour visited the world famous La Manga resort in Spain in February, where sixteen boys and three members of staff took on the North, West and South courses. Ben Cherkas (L6R2) took an early lead in the tournament with a superb 38 points over the North course, closely followed by Yash Patel (952) and 2008 champion Vivek Patni (1152). Day Two saw Yash stamp his authority on the contest, with an astounding 41 points over the tight West course. Debutant Joel Citron (7C) won shot of the day with a chip-in for a par on the par 5 15th hole. The final round over the Championship South course saw Yash holding his nerve, taking the honours with 37 points to secure the tour title for 2010.



HABS Cross Country Team hits top form

The season started well with the senior team winning the overall District title; the team went on to take the lead with a strong showing in our showpiece relay event, the Goater Cup, in January. Shortly afterwards, the U13 team were victorious at the IAPS Prep School Area Championships, led home by Jonny Daitz (8R).

The school's own season-long competition for the Ultimate Loop has already seen three school records smashed by Tommy Almond (7M), Elliot Reidy (8C) and David Fernie (11R2) but the pinnacle has to be the new overall school record set by Max Jenkins (L6M2) who took six seconds off the old school record to set the new overall best of 9:22 for the 2800 cross country kilometres. Max continued his great form by taking ninth place in the Hertfordshire County Championships - a performance which sees him shortlisted to represent the county nationally.





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Rugby 7s The season started with the Fraser Bird tournament: Elstree finished third behind Monmouth and Adams. All three of our teams played well but as fatigue set in, our challenge faltered against a very durable Adams school. The U13 and U18 squads will contest the Hertfordshire 7s before finishing the season at Rosslyn Park. The U13s also compete at the Berkhamsted 7s. The U16 and U14 squads will appear at the South of England competition at QE Barnet before the U16s finish at Rosslyn Park.



Hockey

The 1st XI started the season against St Albans but, despite some courageous defending, they failed to find the net and the opposition scored a controversial late goal. Next came a strong Challoners' side. Against Stowe, the boys conceded a sloppy goal after rather lax defending. Having seen the 1st XI lose to St Albans the 2nd XI were keen to get their season off to a flying start. However, they lost out to a team of greater physical prowess, despite a goal from Salil Patel (L6R2). Against Stowe, the players raced into an early lead with a slick short corner routine from midfielder Ben Jacobs (U6H1); Salil Patel later cemented the victory.



Swimming

This season has seen terrific performances, ranging from the Intermediates storming their way to the top of the podium to Ishwar Mahesh's (L6S1) unparalleled 100m individual medley swim. The Junior team glided into third place, missing the silver by just two points, and the Seniors achieved a solid fourth place out of nine competing teams. The season witnessed outstanding swims from Harry Jukes (8R), JJ Dixon (10C1), Hugo Cliff (10R1), Jared Baker (10C1), Edward Allchorne (11S2) and Sachin Hoyle (L6J2). Help and support from Mr Stiff and captain Peter Kempl (L6M2) has enabled us to have a verv successful season.

Water Polo

The Water Polo club have performed strongly this term. The U19s and U15s have qualified for the schools' league final. The U19s scraped through at Harrow with Jeremy Hasson (11M1) winning the game with a fantastic back shot. The U15s have won every game in both qualifying tournaments and are favourites for the title. The U14s have competed strongly and are prepared for the upcoming national tournament and schools league programme. HABS has continued to gain representative honours with Jared Baker (10C1) and Tom Dean (11M1) performing well at Great Britain trials. At the time of writing the club is in a strong position to challenge for further honours.

Badminton

Sachin Hoyle (L6J1) and Sahil Shah (L6J2) were runners-up in the Harrow Five Schools Badminton Tournament, which bodes well for next year. In addition, Neeloy Banerjee (U6J2) organised the first of what we hope will be a tradition of mixed matches with the Girls' School.
