#### **Child Soldiers**

In April, the school's work to increase awareness of the problem of Child Soldiers in Africa culminated in a stunning evening performance event involving music, dance and personal testimony. Our visitors from Uganda - Martin Mapenduzi, Emmanuel Awio and Michael Okello - had spent three days in classrooms, entertaining and educating the boys, and they finished performances before the L6th and an audience of



parents, pupils and friends of the school. Emmanuel Jal, a former child soldier in the Sudan, brought rap music, poetry, personal testimony and much good humour to the party. Martin Mapenduzi spoke eloquently about the tragedy of child soldiers, adding enormously to our knowledge and understanding of the problem. Acting Headmaster Mr Judd said, 'There can be few more important issues for our students, as global citizens, to understand, and it was a powerful opportunity to hear - first hand - of this compelling story of personal tragedy, fortitude and forgiveness. Our Ugandan guests were compelling, powerful and humbling - it was an evening not to be forgotten.'

## 75th Blood Donation Session at HABS

### Junior and Middle School Plays

This term's Junior Production, Sean and The Tiger, brought together two plays by Ted Hughes for an exciting and visually vibrant performance. The first act took the audience on an epic journey in the quest for worldly knowledge which, like all good farces, builds towards disaster. It was directed by the Drama Department's Director-in-Residence, Mr Sayer. The second act, directed by Mr Cox, took the audience on a smaller journey using projections and subtle lighting to depict a wacky and outlandish world full of both evil and goodness. The audiences were quick to point out that this was a vintage year with some of the strongest performances from boys in Years 7 and 8 seen over the last decade. No sooner was it over than rehearsals were picking up the pace in anticipation of this summer's Middle School production, Oliver Twist, adapted by Neil Bartlett from the Dickens novel, and directed by Mrs Morris-Wolffe, with the assistance of Mr Sayer. ### Old Haberdashers' News

HABS boys have a tradition of doing some excellent work for charity and Miles Kaye (Russells, 2010) and Josh Cowan (Hendersons, 2010) are no exception. In December 2010, Miles and Josh, along with Josh's father Mike, climbed Africa's Mount Kilimanjaro. Their efforts raised around £10,000 for Help the Heroes, MacMillan Cancer Care, the Stroke Foundation and World Jewish Relief.



Professor David Latchman (Meadows, 1974) was awarded a CBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours for his services to Higher Education. David is currently the Master of Birkbeck College, University of

London and

also holds a chair in Genetics.

Award-winning documentary director, Peter Kosminsky (Hendersons, 1975) received a BAFTA nomination for his Channel 4 production The Promise, aired in February 2011. The documentary, set in Palestine during the late 1940s, follows the story of British



soldiers and how their experiences have contributed to the situation in Israel and Palestine today.

Old boy Ben Ashenden (Meadows, 2008) returned to HABS with the Cambridge Footlights comedy theatre troupe this term. Ben joined the troupe whilst studying at Cambridge University where he is now in his final year. Footlights ran a workshop with the boys and performed their show, *Pretty Little Panic*. The show is touring the UK, including the Edinburgh Fringe Festival before heading off to America.



Professor **Geoffrey Crossick** (Joblings, 1964) has become the new Vice-Chancellor of the University of London. After leaving HABS, he studied History at Cambridge, developing an interest in British and European urban social history. Geoffrey became a Professor of History and later Pro-Vice-

Chancellor (Academic Development) at the University of Exeter. Now he is a prominent figure in higher education policy making with a keen interest in the arts and humanities.



Obituary Col. David Sime 1920 - 2010

David was the Chair of the Haberdashers' Board of Governors when the new Prep School was opened by Princess Margaret in 1983. He studied Economics at Cambridge



before embarking on a distinguished Army career in the 1940s, earning him the Military Cross. After the war, he trained as an accountant and moved to London. He became Master of The Worshipful Company of Haberdashers in 1975, 1976 and 1989 and here his links with the Elstree schools began.

## **Awards and Achievements**

### HABS Boy wins Wings of Hope Award

In April, Shivankit Hora (10C1) was the youngest member of the three-man winning team, Evolution, the Overall Winners of the 2010-2011 Wings of Hope Achievement Award. Shiv received the award at Wembley Stadium. His prize consists of a fully paid trip to India to see and work in the schools that Wings of Hope has built in Chennai, India. Other highlights include having tea with the British High Commissioner in New Delhi.

### HABS win Regional Maths Team final

In May, HABS won the Regional Final of the UKMT Team Maths Challenge. Thirty schools took part, and despite some strong opposition, the HABS team, consisting of Sajan Rajani (9S1), Mukunth Raveendran (9C2), Kripa Panchagnula (8H) and Philip Peters (8H), came through as the winners with a score of 229/240. As we go to press, HABS are participating in the National Final.



## Outstanding Success in the International Chemistry Olympiad

Nick Parker (U6C2) has become the second student from HABS in three years to be selected to represent Great Britain in the International Chemistry Olympiad. As we go to press, he will be joining his three other teammates to compete in the International Chemistry Olympiad, which is held this year in Ankara, Turkey. This accolade and exciting opportunity is a fitting reward for Nick, who was Chief Editor of SCOPE magazine and Vice-Chairman of the Science Society this year; he also achieved a Gold medal in the Physics Olympiad and has been offered a place at Cambridge to read Natural Sciences.



### Boys on Top of the World

Jacob Whitehead (8J) and Will Withyman (8C) escaped the Royal Wedding weekend in late April to climb the fifteen highest mountains in Wales and at the same time raised £1,300 for Kidzcare Tanzania, our school charity. The Welsh 3000s are recognised as a tough challenge and involved three long days climbing the Snowdon peaks, the Glyder-Elidir range and the Carneddau: in total 13,000 feet of climbing over thirty miles.



### National Level Sportsman on the HABS staff

Andrew Keenleyside, Head of Art, has recently been selected for the **England Hockey Team** (Vintage Seniors over 55s). Following his success on the East of England team, the next few months see Andrew representing England at hockey around the world at the Home International Tournament in Belfast, the European Championships in

### **U6th Düsseldorf Work Experience Exchange**

Earlier last term a large number of Prep boys took part in the qualifying rounds for the UK



## **Sport**

#### **Tennis**

The standard of tennis played this season has been consistently high. At senior level, club captain Rishi Chotai (L6S2) has struck up an excellent doubles partnership with both James Soo (U6H1) and Joe Gold (11H2). They earned a hard fought win in the National Cup against Aldenham. At the other end of the school the potential was clear to see in a comfortable victory for Year 7 over Hitchin Boys. James O'Brien (7R) and Vishaal Patel (7S) led a talented group of individuals which bodes well for next year's U13 County and District competitions. There have been mixed fortunes in the Aegon County League but wins over Tring at U13 level and St Albans at U15 level were encouraging. The Year 9 1st VI of Andrew Gilbert (9R1), Krish Majithia (9J1), Justin Mullem (9S1) and Irfan Allana (9S1) have performed admirably in the County League. Our District teams have also performed consistently well in all three age groups, remaining unbeaten and look on course for the finals of the Nicola Mabbit Trophy. As we go to print the Inter House Tennis Competition is still in full swing. The standard of tennis in the Junior School competitions was excellent and highly competitive, with many closely fought matches.

### **Athletics**



Earlier in the term, three school Athletics records were broken. Max Marmor (8H) smashed the old 400m record with an outstanding run in a Herts League meeting - the new record is now 57.00. At the same meeting, Gideon Daitz (7R) broke the 30 metre Javelin barrier with a throw of 31.50. During the first

round of the ESAA Track and Field Cup, Harry Kingdon (9S2) and Ben Jones (9C1) claimed the Year 9 Hammer record between them. Also in May, Darius Price (11H1) won the gold medal in the High Jump at the Middlesex County Championships. Darius jumped 1.85m to clinch

Elsewhere, competing in the second round of the ESAA Track and Field Cup competition at the Watford track in June, Harry Mistry (10M2) managed to produce a lifetime best performance to not only win the competition, but also to break his own school record by 2 metres. His new record now stands at 48.35.



HABS Golfers found the going tough at the Independent Schools' Golf Association National finals day at Lingfield Park in May. HABS' lowest three handicappers, William Aldred (10S2, scratch), Harry Kovenklioglu (L6J2, 5) and Aidan Kovenklioglu (9J2, 7) travelled to their first National finals in anticipation of taking on the top independent schools, including Millfield and Loretto School. The first day's play saw windy conditions, and while Aldred performed with credit, HABS' team score saw us propping up the table. The second day saw HABS' team score improving to thirteenth out of fifteen competing schools. With all three players eligible for selection next year, HABS are hopeful for a return to the finals in Scotland and an improved showing in the overall rankings.



### Water Polo

After some tough training sessions in the pool, the HABS U16 Water Polo team travelled to Walsall Gala Baths with Mr Matthews and Mr Stiff for the ESSA National Finals in May. We quickly advanced through the group stages, beating both Bolton School and City of London School. The next game was against King Edwards School, Birmingham. A great defensive performance from the team saw HABS emerge victorious, 4-1. The final was played against defending champions, Manchester Grammar School. HABS finished triumphantly at 5-3. The victory is only the second in HABS history, the last time being in 1998. It was watched by a strong number of HABS parents and teachers whose support encouraged the team through some of the tougher moments.

### Cricket

The 1st XI has been in excellent form this season, winning all six games up to the half term break in comprehensive style. Our successes include victories against a strong MCC side and Merchant Taylors', and a first away win at Bedford Modern School in over twenty years. Elsewhere, the success rate of nearly 75% stands comparison with recent seasons. The 2nd XI and 3rd XI have both lost just one game while winning on nine occasions between them. Likewise the U15A and U13A sides have lost just once and, together with the U14As have made good progress in the Hertfordshire Schools cup

competitions. The U12As have also performed well, winning the Plate Competition at the St Albans Festival, while our B and C teams at each age level have enjoyed much success too. In addition the U13 squad enjoyed a very successful tour to Devon during the half term break, winning all three games. At the time of writing, we look forward to continued success in the second half of term, which will include block fixtures against Abingdon and Bancroft's, the annual Fraser Bird match and our second Cricket Week.
