## **Awards & Achievements**

### **International Debating Victory**

In May, Hasan Dindjer (U6H2) and Edward Schwitzer (U6R2) won the International Schools' Mace Competition, held at Glasgow University.

# **Trips**

### **Dusseldorf Exchange**

Earlier this term, seven budding linguists arrived in Dusseldorf for the annual work experience exchange. The group toured Cologne, Bonn and Dusseldorf. The work placements themselves were a resounding success. The students worked in some of the finest German firms ranging from Deutsche Bank to a horse clinic; in doing so, they significantly improved their linguistic skills and gained an insight into pursuing careers outside the UK. ## Stuttgart Exchange

This summer saw the eleventh HABS Stuttgart Exchange and it was without doubt one of the most enjoyable.



The German enthusiasts spent time in a local school and they also explored the city. This included a trip to the Aquatoll swimming complex, shopping in Heidelberg, a tour of the Ritter Sport chocolate factory and a visit to the world famous Wilhelma Zoo. The traditional sporting afternoon was as successful as ever, but despite our best efforts, the German footballers triumphed. Mr Donaghey and Frau Tebb, and Herr Metzger on the German side, invested much effort in organising the Exchange and for this they must be thanked.

### Lanzarote Warm Weather Training

The volcanic ash that brought flights to a standstill in April meant that there was an unscheduled extended stay at Club La Santa in Lanzarote as part of this year's Warm Weather Training programme. For the large part, it was without doubt one of the very best trips with the boys and staff working very hard, both on the track and in the field, developing their fitness and techniques. All boys recorded Personal Bests in many events. Beyond athletics, the boys had the opportunity to take part in different activities, including swimming, beach volleyball, diving, snorkelling, kayaking and canoeing. These activities continued once the group learned that they would be delayed in returning to the UK. The staff were impressed with the boys' maturity and outstanding attitude in coping with a rather difficult situation.

The Summer Concert similarly highlighted the versatility and talent throughout the school. # **Sport**

#### **Tennis**

The depth in ability throughout the school, together with the enthusiasm and commitment of our tennis players, has ensured a very successful start to the season. In the Aegon County League, the U13 team have lost just once whilst the U15s look set to make the semi-final after winning all of their fixtures to date. Felix Taljaard (10M2) has been particularly impressive, winning successive championship tie-breaks. Our District teams have also performed well and look on course for the finals of the Nicola Mabbit Trophy. Earlier in the term, HABS was fully represented at the Herts County Doubles Championships. In the U14 competition, Harry Mistry (9M2) and Ed Curtis (9S2) managed a great run but in a hotly-contested final against St Albans, our pair went down 6-4. At the time of writing, the ISTA competitions at Eton are yet to be played; HABS have also entered the senior Youll Cup, the U15 Thomas Bowl Cup and the U13 John Barrett Cup. As we go to press, the Inter House Tennis Competition is in full swing. The standard of tennis in the Year 7 and Year 8 competitions was excellent. Russells and Strouts took the honours in these competitions, respectively.



This term saw three new school Athletics records being set by some of HABS' Elite Squad athletes. Ben Jones (8C) now has the school record for the U14 Hammer with a throw of 30.86m. The Javelin record has been broken no less than four times by Joe Bamford (10M2), with the new record now standing at 46.35m. The Captain of the U16 team and the National UK Champion for the Triple Jump last year has set a new school record with a massive jump of 13.03m. Other members of the Elite Squad produced some outstanding performances in the recent ESAA Track and Field Cup, including Phillip Sadgrove (10M1) for the Shot Putt and Hurdles, Henryk Hadass (9R2) for the Discus and Hurdles and Arshia Hasemi (10M2) for the 400m.

At the time of writing, both the U14 and U16 Athletics teams lead their Herts league tables: the former by 15 points, the latter by 30. In the ESAA Track and Field Cup both teams have qualified for the regional finals with some very encouraging scores: the U16 have the fourth best score nationally and the U14 have the fifth best. Regional and national finals are due to take place as we go to press.



#### Cricket

HABS Cricket Club has seen much success this term. The current Year 11 has added strength and depth to our senior sides and the 2nd XI and 3rd XI are both currently undefeated. The 1st XI has produced mixed results to date, with comfortable wins against Mill Hill and St Albans but three defeats at the hands of Harrow, Berkhamsted and Bedford Modern. Kushal Patel (L6C1) has led the way with the bat, while Shanil Patel (L6C1) and Ben Cherkas (L6R2) have been the most consistent bowlers. The U15A, U14A and U13A sides took part in the Hertfordshire County Cup Competitions and, at the time of writing, all three have reached the quarter-final stage at their respective levels. B and C teams, particularly in the U13 age group, have also performed well and mention should be made of the encouraging start to the season by our U12 sides, with thirteen victories between them.

There have been some fine individual performances: notably, maiden centuries from Hugh Brannan (L6H1), James Lawrence (10H2) and Noah Levy (10J2) and five or more wicket hauls for Arjun Popat (11S1), Paddy Sidwell (8M), Jay Purohit (8C), William Wright (9R2) and Noah Levy again.

Elsewhere, the U13 squad enjoyed a short trip to Devon and the 1st XI recently embarked on its annual tour. HABS also hosted its inaugural Cricket Week. Meanwhile, in a new venture, the U14s will be playing in the Cotswolds and we are hoping to take two development squads to South Africa next February.
